INTRODUCTION

The items are described in and maintained in accordance with the appropriate 108F Air Publication. All functional items of the assemblies are issued and fitted initially to all crew members by the Aero Medical Training Centre, RAF North Luffenham, Reference is to be made to the Aero Medical Training Centre, and the Royal Naval Survival Equipment School, Seafield Park, for fitment of clothing for casual flight use.

EMERGENCIES

3 Details of emergency procedures are contained in the Flight Reference Cards and the appropriate Aircrew Manual.

ORDER OF DRESSING

4 Thermal comfort in flying clothing is designed on the layer principle and layers can be added or removed as desired. It is important to note, however, that although the immersion coverall will provide protection against water, survival time depends on protection against the cold and this can only be provided by adequate clothing beneath the immersion coverall. Lightweight aircrew boots are to be worn only in tropical or temperate summer environments.

5 A Survival Equipment Fitter or other suitably qualified tradesman should be available to render assistance when necessary. The following order of dressing is recommended:

5.1 Vest and drawers

5.2 Socks

5.3 Coverall (air-ventilated)

Note . . .

Pass the hoses of the air ventilated coverall and anti-g trouser through the slit provided on the aircrew coverall or through the sealing sleeves on the immersion coverall.

5.4 Trousers (anti-g)

5.5 Shirt and jersey

5.6 Coverall, inner

- 5.7 Coverall, aircrew  
or  
Coverall, immersion  
or  
Suit, cold weather, Mk 3
- 5.8 Boots
- 5.9 Garters, leg restraint (see 'Note' at Chap 3, para 5)
- 5.10 Skeletal harness complete with life preserver

Note . . .

The man-mounted oxygen regulator (Type 317A, Mk 1) and the PEC man portion should be pre-fitted to the life preserver.

- 5.11 Connect the hoses (air-ventilated coverall and anti-g trousers) to the PEC man portion.
- 5.12 Helmet; connect mic-tel lead plug to PEC lead socket.
- 5.13 Oxygen mask; connect hose to the man-mounted regulator.
- 5.14 Gloves

#### FUNCTIONAL TESTS

- 6 Final pre-flight tests of the equipment must be made by the aircrew utilizing the aircraft systems in accordance with current Service instructions.
- 7 Periodically routine tests of the equipment must be made using the Universal Test Rig Cabinet Mk 4 in accordance with current Service instructions.
