PART 3 : RADIO AIDS

INTRODUCTION

1. This part gives practical information on the operating principles and uses of pilot- and crew-interpreted radio aids, airborne R/T equipment, and the ground D/F organization.
2. The information is confined to equipment which is now, or shortly will be, in service use.
3. The basic principles of radio and radar have been omitted to prevent the part from becoming too involved. Attention is, however, directed to A.P. 1234E (Manual of Air Navigation : Radio Aids) for further information on radio theory.
4. Radio aids that are outside the scope of this part are also fully described in A.P. 1234E, but those classified as flight instruments, *i.e.* radio and radar altimeters, I.L.S., and the zero reader, are described in ~~this part~~. **PART 2.**
5. Reference should be made to current Radio Facility Charts, Pilot's Handbooks, and Supplementary Flight Information Documents, for current operational information.
