*Notes*

1. Non-ceremonial occasions include when a band is:
  - a. In support of an informal Royal visit.
  - b. In support of a parade on a station when parade personnel are wearing ribbons only.
  - c. In support of a memorial service when the congregation is wearing ribbons only.
  - d. Playing at a function when the musicians are out of sight ie, in a minstrels gallery or organ loft in a cathedral or church.
  - e. Giving an informal band concert.
2. More senior appointments than have been mentioned have not been included in this annex as it is most unlikely that officers and airmen of RAF music services would qualify for these awards.
