THUMB PLATE SWITCHES, DUNLOP SERIES

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Introduction

1. These thumb-plate switches are single-pole switches of the "press-to-make" and "release-to-break" type. They are intended for use on control handles of aircraft. A typical switch is described and illustrated in this Chapter and details of individual types are given in Appendix 1 to this Chapter.

DESCRIPTION






Fig. 1. Sectional view of typical switch

- 2. The general arrangement of a typical switch is shown in fig. 1. It consists of a brass box, the cover of which hinges on a swivel pin at one end. A return spring tends to raise the cover, which acts as a thumb plate for the switch, but is prevented by the curved portion at the outer end which engages on a lip on the box.
- 3. Secured within the box are a carrier plate bearing two fixed lower contacts, and a backing plate. A hole through the base permits the entry of the connecting cables.
- 4. The thumb plate carries a moving contact assembly, with contact blade and two upper contacts. As the thumb plate is depressed, the two lower contacts are bridged; as the operating pressure is released, the thumb plate moves upwards to its original position to break the contacts.
- **5.** The switch is mounted by means of four fixing holes in the base, suitable for 6 B.A. csk/hd. screws.

SERVICING

6. Little servicing is possible with these switches apart from a general inspection for freedom from damage and a check for positive operation. A faulty switch must be renewed complete.

Insulation resistance test

7. Using a 250-volt insulation resistance tester measure the insulation resistance between the contacts. A reading of not less than 5 megohms should be obtained.
